

COURSE	Description
MGT 201	Mgt 201 is one of the core courses in the Master of Management (MM) Program. It will introduce you to the development of management thought that laid the foundations to the various approaches, processes, and principles in managing public and private organizations.
MGT 221	Mgt. 221 is about the concept, principles, policies, processes, and practices of human resource management that define work life experiences and influence overall organizational success in both private and public sectors.
MGT 286	Functions and responsibilities of top management in an organization, factors that affect organizational performance, and the decisions that determine or influence the character, operations, survival and competitiveness of different types of organizations.
PM 211	The course integrates the two disciplines of public organization and governance by exploring the nature, context and diversity of paradigms of public organizations; the theoretical and historical foundations of governance; and, the complexities and challenges of organizing and managing public organizations within the governance framework in the light of emerging public sector reforms and innovations and evolving national development goals and aspirations.
PM 231	It aims to provide the perspectives, organization and processes of fiscal administration covering the areas of revenue generation and administration; public expenditure and budgeting; public borrowing and debt management; accounting and auditing; and intergovernmental relations.
PM 241	The 3-unit one semester course serves to introduce students to the broad spectrum of public policy management which relates to and on how managers will craft a managerial framework of governance to formulate, design, guide and influence public policy reckoned from the external environment.
PM 250	Local Government Administration is one of the specialized course for the degree of Master in Management major in Public Management. Local Government Management delves on the management of public offices in local political units in the provinces, cities, municipalities and barangays, that enjoy a certain degree of autonomy from the national government provided for in the Local Government Code of 1991.
PM 298	PM 298 (Seminar in Public Administration) is a culminating course in the MMPM Program. It aims to provide the students the venue to wrap up their learnings by way of conducting a seminar of any topic in public management.
MGT 299	Methods of management research with emphasis on the major steps in the design and conduct of research; writing, presentation, and evaluation of the research report; and, implications of research to the study and practice of management.
MGT 290	Functions and responsibilities of top management in an organization, factors that affect organizational performance, and the decisions that determine or influence the character, operations, survival and competitiveness of different types of organizations.
BM 211	Various techniques of deterministic optimization involving univariate and multivariate functions. Includes differential and integral calculus, linear systems and matrices, and an introduction to linear

	programming.
BM 230	It covers the process of achieving organizational short-term and long-term goals by coordinating activities, institutions and systems in the creation, communication and delivery of goods and services that have value for customers, clients, partners, communities and society at large.
BM 220	The course delves in the principles of the different parts of management accounting and control systems in a business management approach. The course covers several accounting topics to provide tools for decision making within the framework of organizational strategy.
BM 240	The course deals with the functional area of Operations Management with focus on production management theory and practice, from the fundamentals to the current trends and changes in the discipline.
BM 222	This course deals with the short-range financial planning and the management of the working capital of a business organization.
MGT 297	Critical analysis of management principles and theories as applied to contemporary issues and problems in management settings, local, national, or international.
